## Checklist for revising structure

- Does the sequence of chapters and events make sense?
- □ Do the paragraphs flow in a logical and interesting order?
- □ Are the sentences constructed in a logical and interesting order?
- Are words or phrases frequently repeated in a non-deliberate or accidental way?
- Does the wording avoid clichéd language?
- □ Is any part of your writing unclear or confusing?
